### Ordinary Readings

Instead, these readings follow three different "streams" of texts semi-continuously over a period of weeks. Those planning worship through this season should pick just one of these passages to set the service theme. The others can be included as readings.

## Marking your life by the life of Jesus

### A Reading Plan for 2023

This year Trinity will be following the Revised Common Lectionary Readings for 2023. We believe that a change from the self-developed sermon series approach will be fresh and exciting in its own way.

The 'Lectionary' is a list of Scripture Passages for Christian Worship throughout the world. In this way we are part of a move that seeks to keep the whole Christian world 'on the same page'. The Lectionary is a three-year cycle in which most of the Bible is covered. We are in Year A of that cycle in 2023. The cycle begins on the First Sunday of Advent 2022 and ends on 'Reign of Christ' Sunday, 26<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

The Revised Common Lectionary has been running since 1992 and was developed by the ecumenical liturgical body the 'Consultation on Common Texts'. This lectionary is an adaptation of the Common Lectionary that preceded it. The reading of appointed Scriptures throughout the year is a practice that goes all the way back to our Jewish roots.

The Gospel readings each Sunday will follow the important moments in the life of Jesus, mainly from the Gospel according to Matthew. Following this thread throughout the year will enable you to mark your life by the life of Jesus.

We suggest that in your devotional times you prepare for the coming Sunday by reading the passages that will be read that day. It is best for you to design your own rhythm for doing this, but here is a suggestion:

- Monday = Psalm
- Tuesday = Old Testament
- Wednesday = Gospel
- Thursday = Epistle
- Friday = Gospel again
- Saturday = Psalm again

You will notice that we have underlined one reading per week. This will be the 'controlling lesson'. In other words, the other readings will be read through the lens that it provides. Alternatively, the other readings will help us to understand the controlling lesson.
