Homeless Ministry

- Our soup kitchen in collaboration with Tshepo Community Development Initiative and U-Turn Homeless Ministries as well as the support of volunteers including the Women's Manyano, spent a wonderful morning serving and engaging with the homeless folk who come to Trinity for meals that help sustain them.
- · We sought to provide a day of engaging and meaningful activities with the homeless and in this way to reflect the love of Christ in service to others.
- The day began at 7am with setup and preparation to greet the homeless with a breakfast meal of soup and sandwiches. This was followed by gathering the homeless and doing some light, fun exercise and movement with some singing and music with them.
- · Following this, Pastor Glen lead some worship and gave a moving devotion and one man opened his heart to Jesus.

Homeless Ministry continued

- This was followed by another activity that sought to connect the homeless and everyone present in a game that added to a spirit of togetherness. This was followed by a voucher-earning activity and explanation of the U-Turn voucher earning pop-up shop.
- The homeless engaged in some basic work tasks around the church perimeter and on the property and earned vouchers that they could choose to use at the pop-up shop.
- The day concluded with a hearty lunch of chicken curry and pap which was well received and enjoyed. Both U-turn and Tshepo are involved in providing services and programmes to the homeless that seek to help in motivation for change, rehabilitation and work-readiness and that ultimately seek to provide them with pathways out of homelessness.
- One of the homeless men returned to church the following day having felt he wanted to attend a church service. He expressed gratitude since he was warmer due to the clothes he had obtained. Gratitude to all who helped setup for the day, helped on the day and supported the activities and for all your assistance with tidying up afterwards.

- With Best Health Solutions having 171 kids registered for the community service day our volunteer team chose to divide and conquer! Lauren Graham-Parker gave a presentation on what developmental milestones should be reached during a child's first six years with some very helpful volunteers demonstrating. Having heard and understood and seen practical examples, many moms and babes were split into age groups where our team screened what we know but have now experienced a very impoverished community. 3 children were picked up to have reason for referrals for intervention and the rest ... well they had a lovely time enjoying our company as much as we did theirs.
