



Longing for God's Redeeming Presence

Dear Trinity Family,

We send our warmest Christmas greetings to you, your family, and your loved ones. May the light, love, and hope of our Saviour, Jesus Christ, be with all of us this Christmas Season!

As we journey through Advent we have looked to the theme of 'Longing for God's Redeeming Presence', and it has been a time of deep reflection for many. 2023 has been a year of significant change, as well as a number of highs and lows.

Loadshedding and difficulties in service delivery have been a daily struggle in our city and country. Global unrest, wars in different parts of the world, and the wars in Ukraine and Palestine/Israel have been horrendous to follow. The atrocities of destruction, loss of life, and pain continue to cause

rifts in communities, causing many to reflect on their own faith and turn again to God in prayer. The continued recovery from the Covid pandemic and a struggling economy has also deeply affected many people in our families and community. These are only a few of the many ways 2023 has been a significant and low year for many.

But we are also aware of joy and community experienced this year. At the top of the list is the Springboks winning the Rugby World Cup (can you believe the final was only seven weeks ago?), the way sport and the players gave hope to our nation and brought people together was phenomenal and many agree it was a necessary boost so many around us needed.

But as significantly as that for Trinity Methodist Church have been the continuing offerings and service at Trinity over the whole year. Every week we have faithfully offered services where we have prayed, read scripture, sung together, and had fellowship, all made possible by volunteers and the service of many. Many of the congregation took part in the Community Service Day, giving back in both seen and unseen ways. All of our Sunday services have grown, and week-on-week we have more people worshipping than we have in previous years. We invited people to connect with Christ in new ways during Lent through the Journey to the Cross. There was a time of revival at the Holy Spirit Day. Both Table Talk and the Missing Jesus course have invited people into a turning and returning to Jesus. This year has been one where Trinity has taken seriously our call to a Great Commitment to the Great Commission. We are deeply thankful for the way God has moved in our community, bringing hope and stability for so many.

It is our prayer that Trinity responds to a world with many needs, including a clear need for everyone to follow Christ, with an invitation to do so and the programmes and tools to help each one of us draw closer to God each day. This Christmas Season, please pray that Trinity will continue to be a place where people can experience God through us. A church community that gathers every Sunday to worship together is a powerful statement, for those in the service and those outside, that God can and does change the world around us.

In this light, we hope you have experienced the joy of being in community at Trinity over the last few weeks. If you've missed any of our advent

gatherings and services, then you have missed out! The Trinity Fusion Choir presented a wonderful Christmas Cantata celebrating the Good News of Christ made real in the world. We sang and enjoyed the Christmas story told through scripture and carols at the Traditional Lessons & Carols Services last week. We had a fabulous time at the annual Christmas picnic (with a special appearance from Father Christmas!) and a great time with young and old singing Carols by Glowstick. God is good and we saw the light of Christ shine on us at each of these.

If you did join us at one or more of these, its our prayer that you drew closer to God in each of them! The great news is that there is still more on offer at Trinity this Christmas and you (and everyone you know) are invited!

Over the last few days in the church office, we have been sporadically singing Christmas carols acapella as we prepare the orders of service and PowerPoint presentations for the Christmas services, but one which has stuck out is the well-known carol, "Come and join the celebration, It's a very special day..." Like the opening line to this carol, we invite you to join the Christmas Celebrations at Trinity this year. The love of Christ is made most real when we celebrate shoulder-to-shoulder with others, and over the coming few weeks there are many ways you can continue to find the love, joy, faith, hope and peace that Christmas celebrations bring.

This is always a highlight of our Advent programme, and it was a lovely way to celebrate Advent Sunday.


