New Sermon Series - Unexpected Guests

30 November to 25 December 2025

...making room for the holy in ordinary places

The Christmas story isn't predictable or neat; it's God consistently breaking into our routines, using everyday people—like Mary and Joseph. It's a powerful reminder that we're all invited to make room for something divine inside us, letting it take shape and show up in the world.

The series is structured around the idea of God as an Unexpected Guest who interrupts our lives through a series of encounters—from the Guest who wakes us, to the Guest who speaks, challenges, costs, comes as a child, and finally becomes the Host who welcomes us home.

Each week of Advent invites us into a movement of grace:

- Week 1, 30 November The Guest Who Wakes Us: From sleep to awakening as hope stirs where we thought nothing new could grow, and God's quiet presence interrupts our comfort.
- Week 2, 7 December The Guest Who Speaks from the Wilderness: From noise to listening as peace begins to form in the still, and where we finally stop striving and start to hear.
- Week 3, 14 December The Guest Who Challenges Our Expectations: From certainty to surprise — as joy breaks in, not because everything makes sense, but because grace turns our expectations inside out.
- Week 4, 21 December The Guest Who Costs Us Everything: From anticipation to surrender as love takes on weight and risk, asking us to carry the promise even when no one else understands.
- Christmas Eve The Guest Who Comes as a Child: The moment of arrival. Wonder takes over as we realise the Creator of the universe shows up as someone small enough to hold.
- Christmas Day The Guest Who Becomes the Host: The final invitation. The Child we welcomed is now the Host who gathers us together and sets the table of grace.

Each day is a gift, a chance to reflect on God's goodness, and share that joy with others.





We are praying for...

We are praying for the commitments made by world leaders at the G20 summit this passed weekend.

In summary the Johannesburg G20 Declaration emphasises *solidarity*, *equality*, *and sustainability*, with a strong focus on the Global South. Leaders committed to supporting debt sustainability for low– and middle–income nations and reforming international financial institutions to better reflect development needs. They pledged to triple renewable energy capacity, scale up climate finance, and facilitate just energy transitions, including clean cooking access through "Mission 300" to electrify millions in Africa. The declaration highlights critical minerals, promoting transparent supply chains and local beneficiation to drive industrialisation. Food security is addressed via "Ubuntu"–oriented, resilient agriculture strategies. To reduce disaster risk, leaders backed early–warning systems and anticipatory financing. The document also stresses digital transformation and AI governance, and calls for peaceful, rules–based conflict resolution, reaffirming support for international law and multilateral cooperation.

The following are good focus points for your prayer:

- Pray that nations commit to disaster resilience, building earlywarning systems that protect the most vulnerable.
- Ask for mercy and justice for heavily indebted countries, that debt relief would free them to invest in their people.
- Pray for a fair and just energy transition, and that climate finance would flow to those who suffer most from environmental change.
- Lift up efforts to reform global financial institutions, ensure food security, and harness technology wisely.
- Finally, pray for peace, fair governance, and global cooperation rooted in respect and mutual dignity.



Financial Update

This is the update that was handed out in printed format at our services last Sunday.

FINANCIAL UPDATE TO MEMBERS - NOVEMBER 2025

This year the Finance & Stewardship Portfolio have experienced some problems with our financial bookkeeping but in the last few months we have thankfully managed to "steady the ship" and plan for Trinity's monthly management accounts be fully up to date during November.

At the Annual Society Meeting in February, members agreed to a budgeted surplus of R22 487 which included income from sacrificial giving of R6 250 000 and R650 000 from special donations.

We embarked on a special drive in the first quarter of the year, including a sermon series based on John Wesley's Sermon 50 on "The Use of Money" where, as a congregation, we were encouraged to "Earn all you can, Save all you can, Give all you can, Grow all you can". Part of the drive was to encourage members to give electronically and/or switch to scheduled payments or stop orders as this can be managed by each person anonymously and is also recognised as an act of worship. We were not dissuaded from giving in collection bags at services as many see this as an act of worship, and private.

Our target was to grow the number of members who regularly give electronically to 400 people. Unfortunately, we have not reached

that target in the year, with about 320 people per month giving in this way. The good news is that through the drive electronic giving has increased this year and the monthly income from this is R400 000–R500 000. The portfolio and leadership of Trinity would like to thank each person who has sacrificially given in the year. Your giving is helping to build God's Kingdom in Johannesburg, supporting multiple outreach projects, and helping us as a community to be 'One Heart, Many Voices' in God's Kingdom.

Of course, you will see that to "balance the books" where R6.25 million is required for the year, an average of R520 000 per month is needed and we encourage any members who have not yet taken up the call to give regularly and sacrificially to prayerfully consider it in the last two months of the year.

Trinity is affected by rising prices and inflation, as we all are. If you already give sacrificially, please prayerfully consider whether you may able to increase this in 2026.

November/December is also a time of receiving blessings for many people, both in the Season of Christmas where we are blessed in the knowledge of God made flesh, but also many people receive bonuses for good and faithful work in the year. If this is the case for you, would you consider a special bequest, using that money to facilitate Trinity to continue its activities and outreach programmes that touch the lives of hundreds of people.
