

At the start of the New Year Methodists make a distinctive resolution. Methodists hold an annual Covenant Service, at which we celebrate all that God has done for us, and affirm that we give our lives and choices to God.

This Service is at the heart of Methodists' devotion, discipleship, and dedication to working for social justice.

In the service, the Church joyfully celebrates God's invitation to all people to be in partnership with God in the work of the church. Christ is the example of this relationship that we look to.

What God offers is a loving relationship.

The Covenant is not a contract in which God and human beings agree to provide particular goods and services for each other! It is not something that we have to do to create a relationship with God. God has freely and graciously already made it possible.

Rather, the Covenant is our gateway to accepting the invitational relationship and the reminder throughout the year to sustain it. It is not so much about acquiring a relationship with God, but living within the loving relationship that God has already offered us.

This is a glorious offer... and at the same time a glorious challenge. If God is committed to us, are we prepared to accept that as reality and commit ourselves in return to God? Even if we do choose to accept it, how can we live out that commitment well?

The New Testament gives a suggestion: we respond to God's invitation and take the first steps of relationship. When we do this with others, like a church family, the Holy Spirit begins to bubble up in us as individuals, encouraging and guiding us to live out our side of the relationship (i.e. "Keep company with [God] and learn a life of love." as Ephesians 5 describes the Covenant).

At the heart of the service is the Covenant Prayer:-

**'I am no longer my own but yours.
Put me to what you will,
rank me with whom you will;
put me to doing, put me to suffering;
let me be employed for you,
or laid aside for you,
exalted for you, or brought low for you;
let me be full, let me be empty,
let me have all things, let me have nothing:
I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things
to your pleasure and disposal.
And now, glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you are
mine and I am yours.'**

The traditional Covenant prayer makes it very clear that accepting this invitation to walk the year with God is serious. It embraces the whole of our life, nothing is left out. Most people find it quite tough to say, and really mean it. But the prayer is so central to the Christian life that we cannot let a year pass without committing to it again.


In our culture we tend to prize our ability to make decisions and choose our own path in life. It can feel very hard to give that up. But this prayer is like a love poem. It is about surrendering to God in love and joy.

**The Covenant service is a gift, not a demand!
And God will give you the grace to do it all.
You are not alone!**



We are praying for...

The world is currently navigating a period of profound geopolitical upheaval, marked by a shift away from international cooperation toward unilateral "America First" policies. The central tension is between power and sovereignty: while large nations exert their will through military interventions (Venezuela) and economic pressure (tariffs and summits), smaller and middle-income nations are struggling to maintain their dignity and the safety of their people.

Key Areas for Prayerful Reflection:

- **Discord Among Leaders:** The U.S. boycott of the G20 in South Africa (November 2025) and its withdrawal from climate frameworks represent a "breaking of bread" at the global table. Pray for a spirit of reconciliation and for leaders to prioritize the "common home" of our planet over political posturing.
- **The Cry of the Oppressed:** Highlighting the Sudan war's expansion, the Iranian uprising triggered by economic hardship, and the instability in the Sahel (Mali, Burkina Faso, Niger) brings focus to

the human cost of conflict. These are not just political events; they are millions of individual lives facing hunger, displacement, and fear.

- **Sovereignty and Peace:** The direct U.S. intervention in Venezuela and the military drills in the Taiwan Strait raise the spectre of "might makes right." You may wish to pray for the protection of national borders and the wisdom of the UN Security Council as it seeks to uphold international law.
- **The "Good News":** The Ethiopia-Somalia Rapprochement (11 January 2026) provides a vital reminder of God's work in the world and an answer to prayer. It serves as a real-world example that even the most bitter "explosions" of tension (like the 2024 port deal dispute) can be healed through dialogue and diplomatic restoration.
