



Covenant Service

At the start of the New Year Methodists make a distinctive resolution. Methodists hold an annual Covenant Service, at which we celebrate all that God has done for us, and affirm that we give our lives and choices to God.

This Service is at the heart of Methodists' devotion discipleship, and dedication to working for social justice.

In the service, the Church joyfully celebrates God's invitation to all people to be in partnership with God in the work of the church. Christ is the example of this relationship that we look to.

What God offers is a loving relationship.

The Covenant is not a contract in which God and human beings agree to provide particular goods and services for each other! It is not something

that we have to do to create a relationship with God. God has freely and graciously already made it possible.

Rather, the Covenant is our gateway to accepting the invitational relationship and the reminder throughout the year to sustain it. It is not so much about acquiring a relationship with God, but living within the loving relationship that God has already offered us.

This is a glorious offer... and at the same time a glorious challenge. If God is committed to us, are we prepared to accept that as reality and commit ourselves in return to God? Even if we do choose to accept it, how can we live out that commitment well?

The New Testament gives a suggestion: we respond to God's invitation and take the first steps of relationship. When we do this with others, like a church family, the Holy Spirit begins to bubble up in us as individuals, encouraging and guiding us to live out our side of the relationship (i.e. "Keep company with [God] and learn a life of love." as Ephesians 5 describes the Covenant).

At the heart of the service is the Covenant Prayer:-

**'I am no longer my own but yours.
Put me to what you will,
rank me with whom you will;
put me to doing, put me to suffering;
let me be employed for you,
or laid aside for you,
exalted for you, or brought low for you;
let me be full, let me be empty,
let me have all things, let me have nothing:
I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things
to your pleasure and disposal.
And now, glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you are
mine and I am yours.'**

The traditional Covenant prayer makes it very clear that accepting this invitation to walk the year with God is serious. It embraces the whole of our life, nothing is left out. Most people find it quite tough to say, and really

mean it. But the prayer is so central to the Christian life that we cannot let a year pass without committing to it again.

In our culture we tend to prize our ability to make decisions and choose our own path in life. It can feel very hard to give that up. But this prayer is like a love poem. It is about surrendering to God in love and joy.

The Covenant service is a gift, not a demand!
And God will give you the grace to do it all.
You are not alone!



Courageous Conversations | Appreciating Differences



COURAGEOUS CONVERSATIONS – FOSTERING DIVERSITY AND INTEGRATION AMONGST OUR MEMBERS

Saturday 7 February | 9.00am to 12.00pm

Courageous conversations in the church context refers to intentional, often difficult, and honest dialogues about diversity and inclusion, intended to move beyond "false harmony" toward true, biblical unity. Addressing diversity requires moving beyond surface-level interactions to explore deeper cultural values and systemic issues.

The focus for our first session will be: *'Reflection on Our Personal Understanding, Knowledge and Behaviour Towards Others Who Are Different from Ourselves – and To Embrace the Differences in Trinity Methodist Church'.*

The aim of this journey is to help members understand, embrace, and faithfully practice biblical imperatives of diversity and inclusion, reflecting Christ's love across culture, race, gender, age, ability, and background.

- It is hoped that those in attendance will gain an increased understanding of Biblical foundations for diversity, inclusion and integration.
- Secondly, that members will appreciate, gain knowledge and understanding of the MCSA's theology, doctrine, ethos, positions, policies, resolutions, statement, etc. that address diversity, inclusion and integration.
- Lastly, that we will begin a journey as individuals to apply our new insights to better understand and accept fellow members.

We are praying for...

This week we pray for the first time this year for **our Police.**

Remember our banner on the corner is telling the community that we are praying for policing that protects and restores trust. This is something we prayed for a few times in 2025 and remain committed to pray about.

We pray around four key points:

First, the severe shortage of detectives — pray for wisdom and resources to fill the more than 2,300 vacant detective posts so that serious crime can be effectively investigated and communities can feel safer. The Minister of Police has acknowledged this national shortage.

Second, the Madlanga Commission of Inquiry — pray for the hearings that are set to resume on 26 January 2026, that truth would be heard, corruption exposed, and pathways to accountability and reform clarified.

Third, morale and encouragement — pray for officers and staff who remain committed to serving South Africa; ask that they find renewed strength, support, and a sense of vocation amid frustrations and setbacks.

Fourth, pray for protection for those who risk their lives in the course of their work.

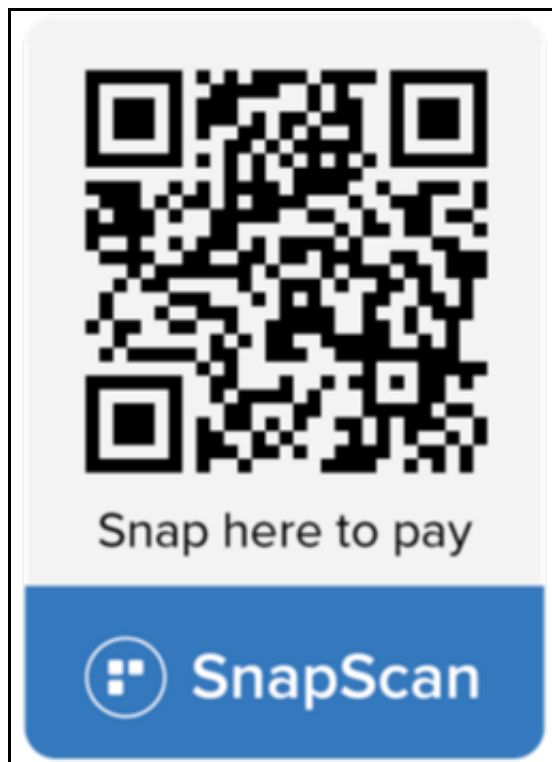
